## WHY CUENCA

### Historic Walled Town of Cuenca

When the Muslims captured the area in 714, they soon realized the value of this strategic location and they built a fortress (called Kunka) between two gorges dug between the Júcar and Huécar rivers, surrounded by a 1 km-long wall. Built in a defensive position at the heart of the Caliphate of Cordoba, Cuenca is an unusually well-preserved medieval fortified city between Madrid and Valencia. Conquered by the Castilians in the 12th century, it became a royal town and bishopric endowed with important buildings, such as Spain's first Gothic cathedral, and the famous Casas Colgadas (hanging houses), suspended from sheer cliffs overlooking the Huécar river. Taking full advantage of its location, the city towers above the magnificent countryside.

On 1996, Cuenca was named World Heritage Site by UNESCO, thanks to the excellent preservation of such an original urban landscape like this medieval fortress, and its rich collection of civil and religious architecture from the 12th to the 18th centuries. To this they added that the city features an exceptional personality, being perfectly integrated into the marvellous natural landscape that surrounds it.

### Cuenca is a lively city

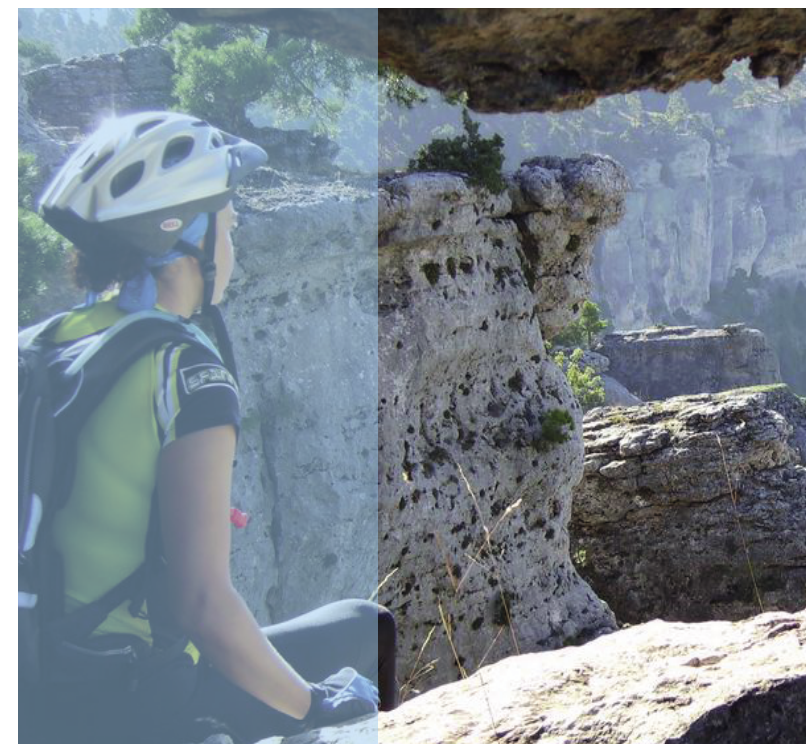

### Spanish Tourism

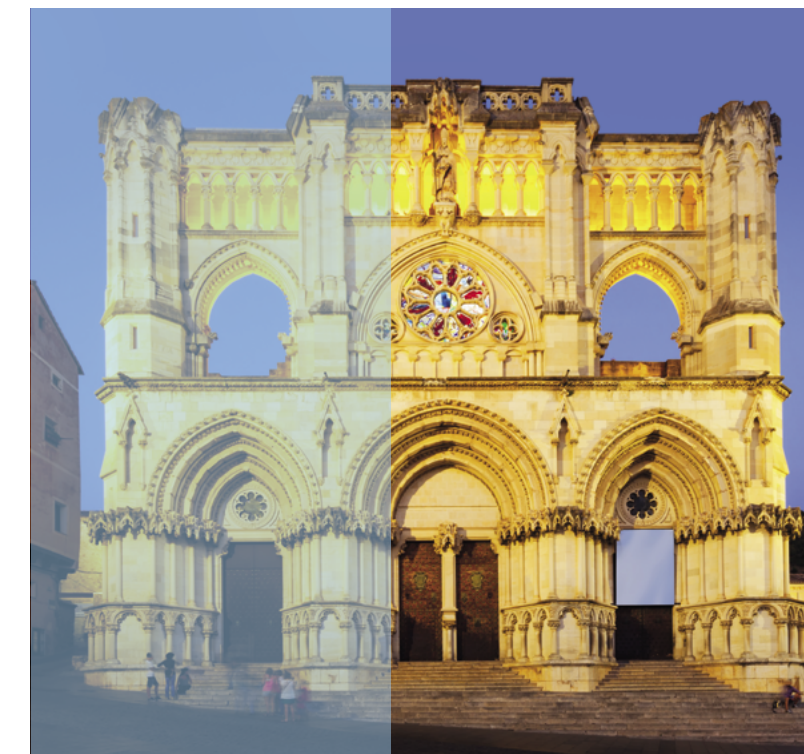

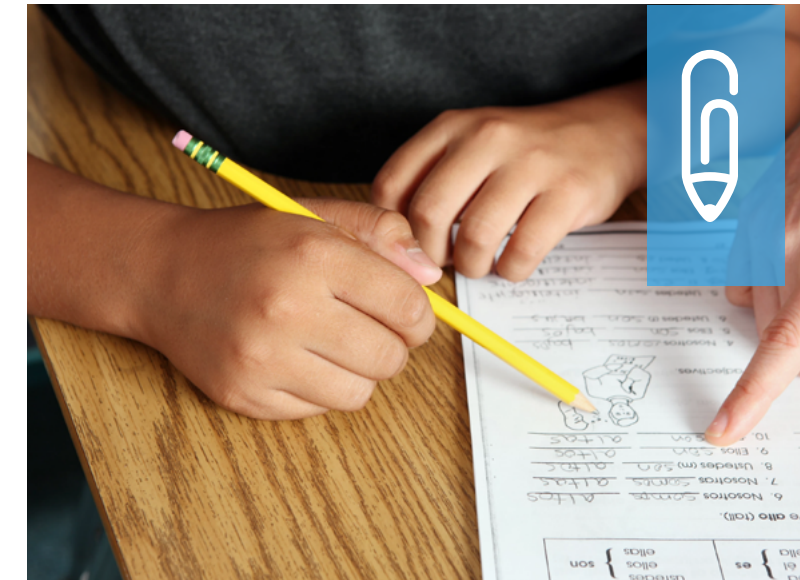

### 01 CANYONING - RIDING - KAYAKING AND MUCH MORE

Cuenca's natural surroundings make it the ideal spot to practice all types of sports and activities. The majority of sports can be practiced right in the city or in the immediate vicinity. The prices shown are given as a guide, but may vary depending on the season or on the organisation chosen to carry out the activity.

### 02 CYCLING (mountain or road Biking)

There are hundreds of routes and paths for all types of cyclists in the city and in the province as a whole. You can choose to travel in the mountains or in valleys, through the hills or on the road. ### 11 CAVING

Cuenca is one of the Spanish provinces in which the most caves can be found. The region was formed by limestone, which erodes in water and, above all, in abrupt temperature changes. Some of the caves in the area are up to 5km long.

The small airfield in Cuenca and some other areas offer the opportunity to fly an ultralight aircraft.



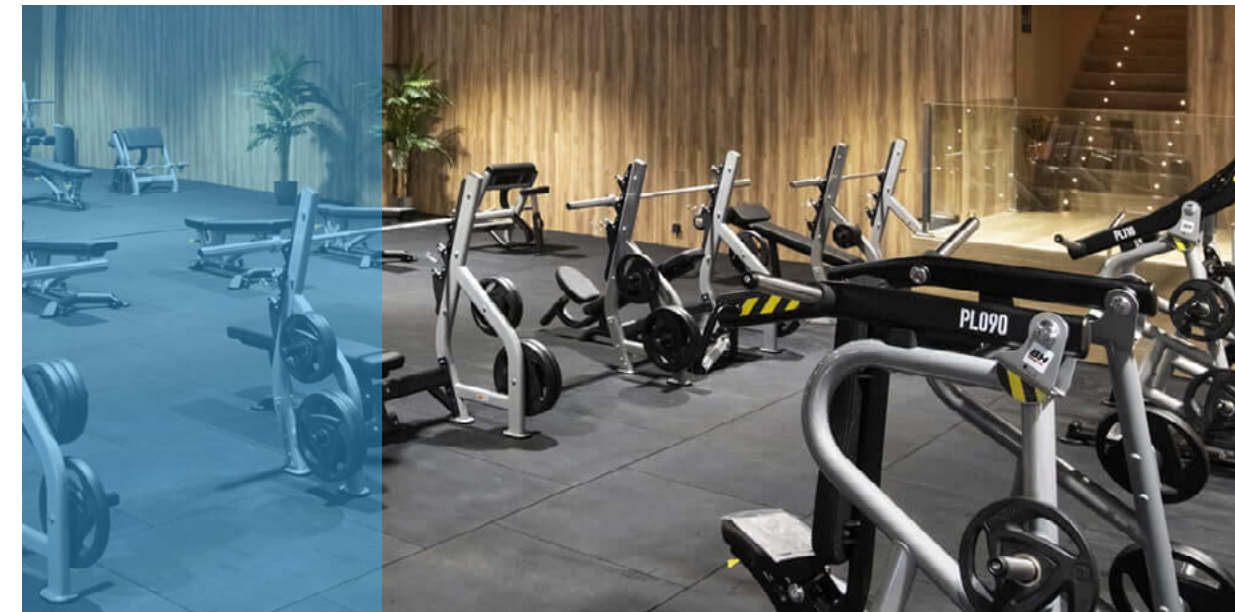

## MADRID Weekend trips

Cuenca and Madrid are well connected by expressway (A40), by the AVE, or high-speed train, which takes 50 minutes and by the regional train, a more economic form a travel, which takes just over 2 hours. There are also regular coach bus lines between the cities, with buses departing every 2 hours.

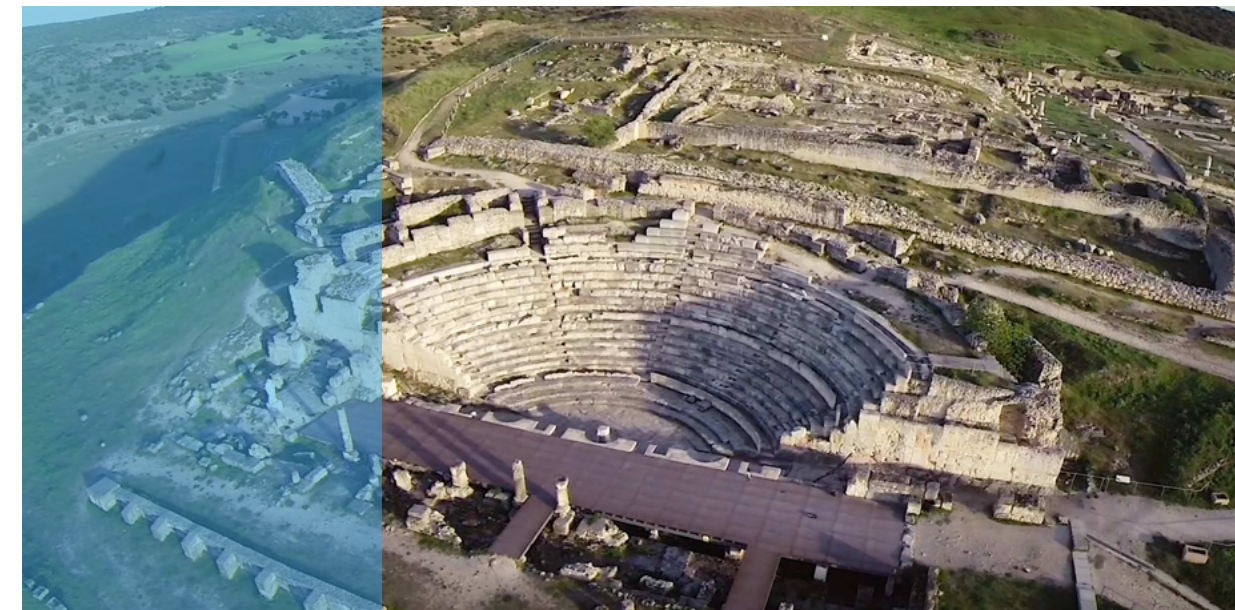
### Excursions with Trivium in the afternoon

## 01 BELMONTE CASTLE AND MILLS

## 02 ROMAN CITIES

There are many Roman cities in the province, including Valeria, Ercávica and Segóbriga.



## 03 CERRO DEL SOCORRO

The Cerro del Socorro (Hill of Assistance) is one of the hills that surround the city of Cuenca. From the top there are incredible views of the whole city and the two canyons. It is a perfect place to have a picnic or see sunrise or sunset.

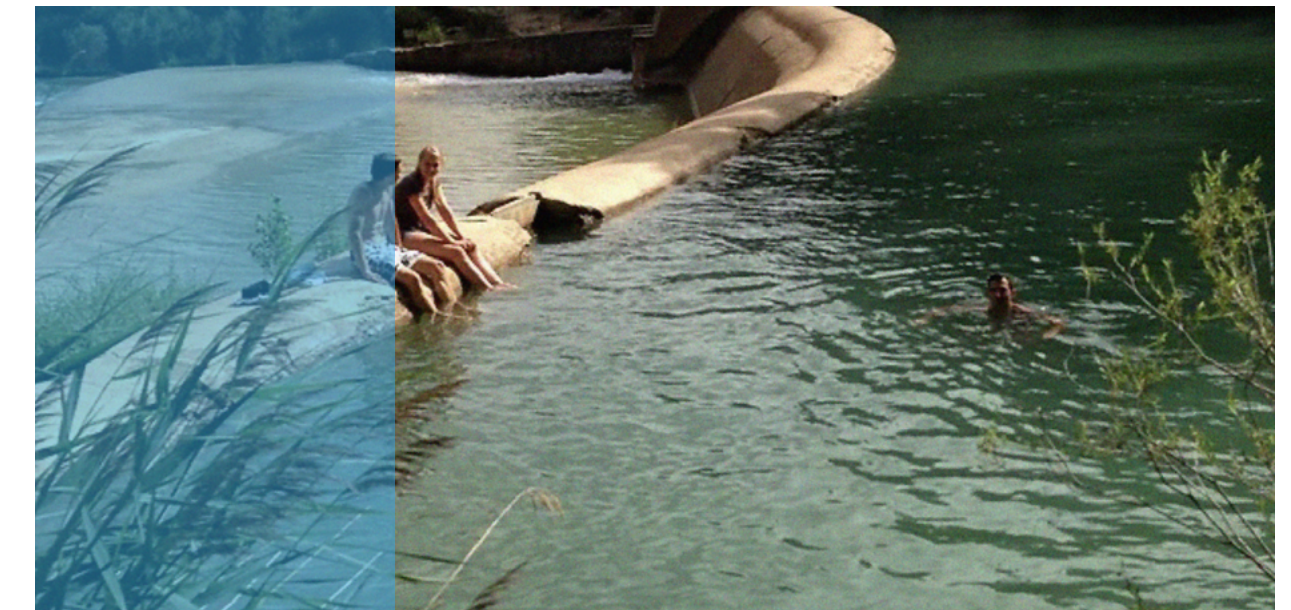
## 04 THE TOBA DAM

One of the most important dams of the region, the Toba Dam is about 40km from Cuenca. The dam is some 1,200 meters high. There are different places in the surrounding area to swim or walk.



## 05 CIUDAD ENCANTADA

The Ciudad Encantada (Enchanted City) is a natural tourism site in the mountains of Cuenca. Here you can see monumental limestone rock formations created by nature itself. We will also explore a cave and cross through the mountainside to see some incredible views.

## 01 MUSEUM OF ARTE ABSTRACTO ESPAÑOL AND WORKSHOP

One of the most important collections of abstract art in the world, which can be found in the Cuenca's Hanging Houses and attached museum, belongs to the Juan March Foundation. After an explanatory tour organized by the museum, you can also gain practical knowledge in a museum workshop.



## 02 SCIENCE MUSEUM

The Science Museum has a collection of fossils from the Las Hoyas paleontological site, projections in its planetarium, and a walking tour through the history of astronomy and evolution among many other interesting exhibits.

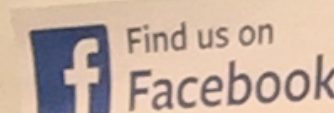

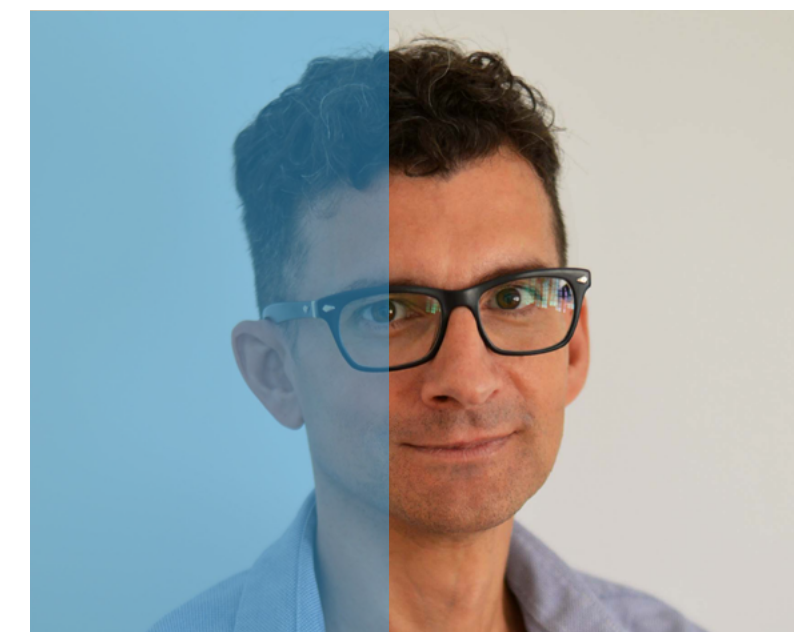
